CORVETTE COLOR CAPERS: Did you ever wonder where Corvette gets some of its color names? Maybe a "red" or "yellow" or "green" or "blue" is good enough for you, but back in the early '70's the trend for naming colors leaned much more toward the exotic. There was Mille Miglia Red in '71-'75; War Bonnet Yellow in '71-'72; Brands Hatch Green in '71; and Bridgehampton Blue and Mulsanne Blue in '70-'71. Did you know there have been 32 different blues (not counting aqua, turquoise or the metallics)? And in 1966 and 1967, there were 3 separate blues offered in each year, none of which had the same name. Daytona played prominently in the color naming process with Daytona Yellow, Daytona Blue and Daytona Sunset Orange. In 1977, there was a Chartreuse, but only one was produced. (Maybe we can guess why!☺) And in 1955 Harvest Gold made its debut (perhaps to match your refrigerator or stove?). So, do you know the "official" color of your Corvette?
